Research Says Go for it

PJ survey:

75% of families are looking for MORE Jewish connections

69% of families say that PJ Library helps them feel connected to a local Jewish community

96% of PJ Library parents say they are proud to be Jewish.

82% of parents said it is VERY important that their children identify as all or partially Jewish

Research Says Go for it

Increased commitment to family

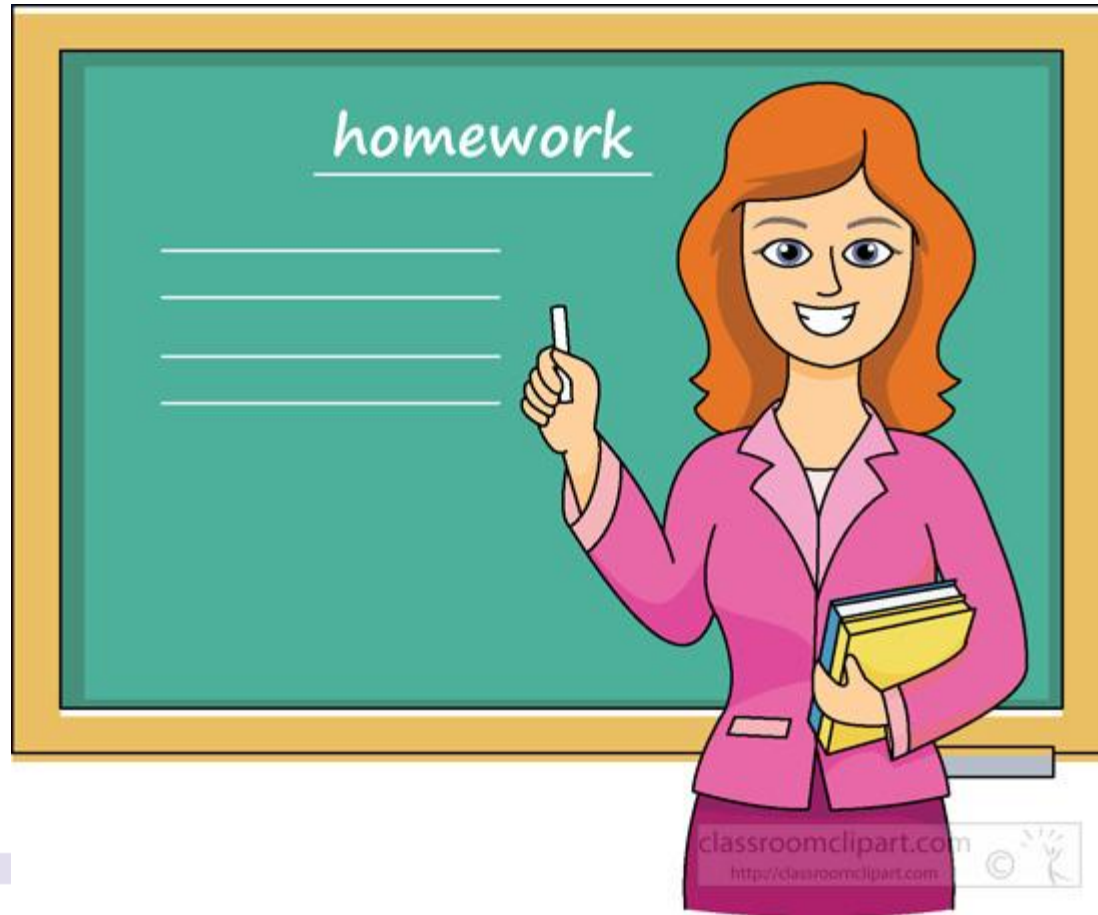
Seeking opportunities for actively engaged family time

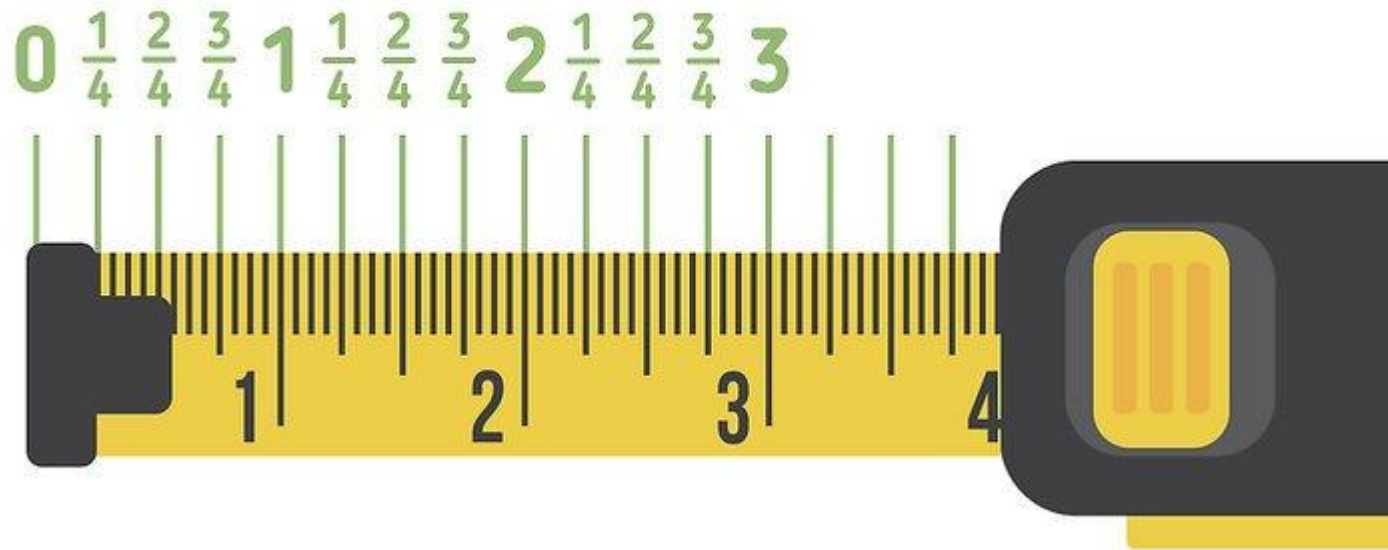
